These courses of study are designed for professionals whose work intersects with the law and the judiciary, especially as consultants, evaluators, investigators and/or expert witnesses. Candidates will be admitted to the track most appropriate to their background and desired area of further study.

Only one 7-day, 3-credit graduate seminar at the summer residency in Saint Kitts & Nevis is required. Candidates may transfer relevant post-baccalaureate courses from any accredited educational institution, whether taken before or after matriculation at IUGS.

Post-baccalaureate CEUs may also be converted to academic credit at the rate of one semester-hour credit for every thirteen and a half clock hours of evaluated continuing education. For CEUs that did not include an evaluation component, the university will administer the evaluation, which, if successfully completed, will allow the credits to be transferred.

Among the organizations from which evaluated CEUs are acceptable are the American Association of Integrative Medicine, the American College of Counselors, the American College of Forensic Examiners International, and the American Psychotherapy Association.

IUGS degree programs are designed to enhance and verify the candidate's ability to function as a professional in the field.
